#### Other

Kompan has replied to the RoSPA report comment as follows "The curly climber that you have on the unit is perfectly safe and fully compliant with BS EN1176 standards. The inspectors comments are correct in that there have been 2 No incidents throughout the whole of the UK where a child has unfortunately trapped their leg or foot, most recent of which occurred in 2019. KOMPAN have sold and installed over 600 of the curly climbers since its launch in the U.K and many thousands worldwide with very few incidents from children playing on them.

It seems we have one Inspector who now puts the two incidents down on any inspection they carry out without actually speaking with KOMPAN to discover the history behind each of the incidents – neither of which were deemed to be caused by a) the product itself and its design and b) the installation.

Therefore please take this email as confirmation that all aspects of the Multiplay Unit are compliant and safe to use."
